## James Cleary, MD, FAChPM

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After graduating from the University of Adelaide Medical School, South Australia, Dr Cleary trained in Internal Medicine and Medical Oncology at the Royal Adelaide Hospital and then doing three years of opioid pharmacology research at the University of Adelaide. He moved to the UW in 1994, where he has developed a Palliative Care Clinic Program, from which he has recently stepped aside as Medical Director. He has global connections in Cancer Pain and Palliative Care, evidence by the releases of the recent Global Opioid Policy Initiative publications for Africa, Asia, the Caribbean and Latin America, India, and the Middle East. He was a Faculty Scholar of the Open Society Institute's Project on Death in America and the 2004 President of the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine. He serves as a North American Editor of Palliative Medicine, the Research Journal of the European Association of Palliative Care. He has served as Program Director of Cancer Control at the UW Carbone Cancer Center.
