Colectivo Ayllú is a collaborative artistic and political research and action group composed of migrants and racialized people who are sexual and gender dissidents from former European colonies in Latin America and the Caribbean. Founded in 2017, the collective critiques colonialism by producing art in multiple formats and fostering collective learning, mediation, and writing. Ayllu—which in Quechua means extended family—is based in Madrid and Barcelona and is articulated as an affective community, a family woven from diverse places, dedicated to the recovery of ancestral memory and transitioning, through alternative poetics, toward shared future spaces.
