# **Tinker Field Research Grants**

## **Call for Applications 2019**

The University of Miami Institute for Advanced Study of the Americas is delighted to announce the 2019 competition for Tinker Field Research Grants for master's, doctoral and professional school students conducting pre-dissertation fieldwork. As early career grants, the Tinker FRGs are aimed at helping graduate students at UM to develop cutting-edge research projects and gain firsthand knowledge of Latin America and the Caribbean. These experiences increase significantly the ability of graduate students to secure external funding for their subsequent research. Equally important, we feel that they are absolutely fundamental for the type of engaged scholarly work that UMIA seeks to encourage. We are excited to be working once again with the Tinker Foundation to realize these objectives.

Tinker FRGs provide funding for graduate students in all disciplines to conduct research in Latin America and the Caribbean (defined by Tinker as "the Spanish- and Portuguese-speaking countries of the Western Hemisphere and excluding Puerto Rico"). The goals of the Tinker Field Research Grants are to: 1) offer students an opportunity to acquire a comprehensive knowledge of language, terrain, and culture; 2) to familiarize themselves with information and sources relevant to their studies; 3) to conduct pilot work and preliminary investigations; and 4) to develop contacts with scholars and institutions in their fields of study. UM graduate students at all levels can benefit from this funding opportunity.

## Eligibility

Graduate students from all University of Miami Schools, Colleges, and Departments are welcome to apply, including, but not limited to, those in the social sciences, STEM disciplines, law, humanities, music, education, and architecture. Non-US citizens are eligible to apply. Citizens of Latin American countries enrolled at UM can receive awards to conduct research in their home countries provided they have no previous field research experience in that country.

Awards will not exceed \$2,000 per student. The research trip must be completed and reimbursement processed by October 1st, 2019.

**Please note:** Awards can be made to graduate students pursuing degrees at the Master's, doctoral, and other levels. The goal is to support varied types of introductory and pre-dissertation field research. Doctoral students are welcome to apply, but these pre-dissertation grants are not intended for students close to finishing their degrees.

### **Application Submission**

Students will submit a full application electronically no later than **March 8th**, **2019**. The application will consist of the following items:

- Tinker Field Research Grant Application Form
- Statement describing the research travel and project to be undertaken and how it relates to degree program (Max. 5 pages long, 12 pt. font, double spaced)
- Proposed itinerary and itemized budget
- Current University of Miami graduate transcript (unofficial is fine)
- CV
- Letter of recommendation from advisor under separate cover

Please send your full electronic application package in <u>one single .pdf file</u> to <u>mia@miami.edu</u> with the following reference line "Tinker FRG Application." Please have your advisor separately submit a letter to <u>mia@miami.edu</u> with the reference line "Tinker FRG Recommendation."

For useful guidelines on writing proposals for research funding, we suggest Adam Pzreworski and Frank Salomon, *On The Art of Writing Proposals* (Social Science Research Council, 1995 rev., 1988).

#### **Selection Process**

UMIA will convene an interdisciplinary committee of faculty with expertise in Latin American and Caribbean Studies from across UM. The committee will select the awardees and determine whether any adjustments or changes should be made to the proposed budget. (Please take care to adequately justify the budget.)

UMIA will notify applicants of the committee's decision by mid April. Awardees will be required to attend an orientation meeting before conducting their research to review the program requirements, UM policies and program rules for spending research funds, and guidelines for reimbursement.

# **Reporting Requirements**

A narrative and financial report of the research trip must be submitted to MIA prior to student reimbursement and within two weeks of concluding the research trip. The narrative report of three pages will include a description of the activities undertaken, research results, and an

explanation of the next stages of the research project. A one-page financial report will present a complete account of expended funds.

Upon their return, awardees are expected to submit an abstract for participation in the Annual South Florida Latin American and Caribbean Studies Graduate Student Conference. In addition to presenting their findings at this conference, students will present their research results to students and faculty members at a symposium organized by UMIA during the academic year following their fieldwork. Awardees will be requested to submit to UMIA any papers or other materials developed as a result of the award. These materials or a portion of them may be featured on the MIA website.

## Guidelines for Disbursement

Grant recipients will receive a disbursement of their award through the Office of Financial Assistance & Employment. Travel expenses must comply with the university policy for Travel & Business Expense Reimbursements. Recipients must also comply with UM's requirements for International travel, <u>https://business-services.miami.edu/departments/travel-management/international-travel/index.html</u> and obtain any necessary approvals required prior to travel. UMIA staff will assist and submit on your behalf your reimbursement package for approval. <u>Original receipts will be required.</u>
